## Fountain East Safety Patrol

Our evening patrol is a volunteer opportunity for you to help keep our park safe and secure; however, it is every resident's responsibility to be aware of suspicious activity and/or people in the park. #### Safety First!

It is important to remember that being stopped in the park and asked if you are a resident is like going through TSA at the airport. It is for your safety, and that of other residents, to know who is and who is not supposed to be here. That you are not known and questioned is not anything against you personally. We do not have the same people on patrol each night so often they are not familiar with residents they have not met or seen around the park. Be thankful that someone cares enough to take the time to make sure you, or any other person unknown to them, is supposed to be in the park. It is always a good thing to get to know your neighbors and for them to get to know you.
