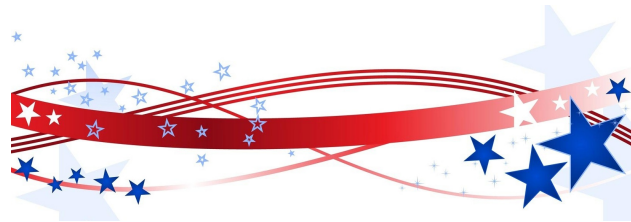
In & Out of the Park
